- CONGRATULATIONS to ALL!!! We made our goal for The Archbishop's Catholic Appeal: 2017. There have been 106 gifts averaging \$110 for a total of \$11,690, which is over 100% of our goal of \$11,611.49.

- The Christmas Season ends Monday night. On Monday, January 8, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This event in the life of Jesus marks the transition from his private life to his public ministry. It also marks the transition from the Christmas Season to Ordinary Time. Like the Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord is a manifestation of Jesus, telling us something important of who he is. After his baptism, a voice came from the heavens: "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

NATIONAL MIGRATION WEEK: January 7-13, 2018
For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week, which is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking. The theme for National Migration Week 2018, "Many Journeys, One Family," draws attention to the fact that each of our families have a migration story, some recent and others in the distant past. Regardless of where we are and where we came from, we remain part of the human family and are called to live in solidarity with one another.

Unfortunately, in our contemporary culture we often fail to encounter migrants as persons, and instead look at them as unknown others, if we even notice them at all. We do not take the time to engage migrants in a meaningful way, as fellow children of God, but remain aloof to their presence and suspicious or fearful of them. During this National Migration Week, let us all take the opportunity to engage migrants as community members, neighbors, and friends.

The commemorative Centennial mugs that were handed out at Christmas should not be washed in the dishwasher. They should be washed by hand. The dishwasher will wash off the commemorative logo or at least make it fade. If you did not get a commemorative Centennial mug, it is still possible to get one. One mug per family. Also books are available. One book per family.

The Blessing of the Chalk takes place at today's Masses. This chalk may be used to write a "blessing" above or around your door, invoking Christ and the three Magi to be a blessing to all who enter and leave your home. Remember that the blessed chalk is a sacramental and should be treated respectfully, like a holy card. It is not a toy, nor should it be thrown in the garbage. After you use it to write a blessing at your door, I'd say you can use the chalk as chalk, but any leftover piece should be buried in a place that will not be disturbed, or you can bring it to Fr. Pat in the envelope.

Next week our Second Collection is for the Catholic Communication Campaign. This campaign connects people with Christ, here and around the world in developing countries, through the internet, television, radio, and print media.
