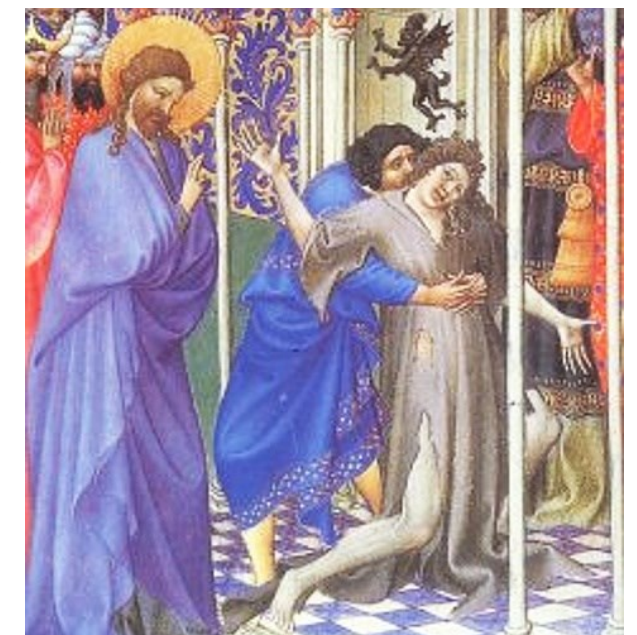
**Mark 1:21-28**

**Papal Intention for January (Evangelization):** That Christians and other religious minorities in Asian countries, may be able to practice their faith in full freedom.

January has two full moons—both Super Full Moons—on January 1 and 31. The latter full moon is also part of a lunar eclipse that peaks at 5:29 am.

Beginning January 20, the sun will be setting after 5 pm until November 1. Also, beginning January 18 daylight is increasing by more than 2 minutes per day. By February 16 daylight will be increasing by more than 3 minutes per day.

- We are holding a **warm clothing/blanket drive**. Bring us your clean and new or slightly-used jackets, sweatshirts, coats, sweater, hats, gloves, socks, blankets and sleeping bags. Ask your family and friends to help. This drive continues through January 31. A box is available in the entrance of the church near the St. Vincent de Paul hamper. - Friday, February 2 is the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It is also known as "Candlemas Day". It is the day that candles are blessed. The blessing takes place at the beginning of 9 am Mass on February 2. Bring your candles that you would like blessed.
- You can start bringing your palm branches to Church and place them in the metal container near the baptismal font.
- The palm branches will be burned at our Fat Tuesday Pancake dinner, on the evening of Tuesday, February 13.
- For Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, we will have faith sharing groups using Pope Francis' encyclical **Laudato Si'** as the basis for our learning, prayer and discussion. This encyclical is also known by its English title: "On Care for our Common Home". Sign up sheets are available for you to sign up in one of the small Lenten groups. Everyone is encouraged to participate in one of the groups.
