February 4: Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

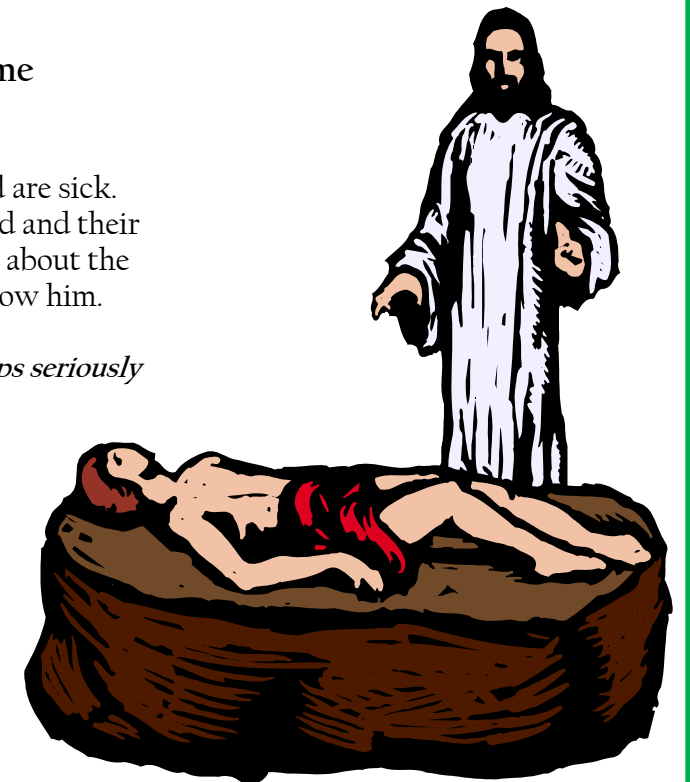
Mark 1:29-39
