Below is the reflection usually found on the front of the bulletin, next to the clip art.

In today's Gospel Jesus proclaims that we "are the salt of the earth" and warns us not to lose the taste. He goes on to proclaim that we are also "the light of the world" and tells us not to hide our light. With these metaphors, Jesus tells his disciples—which means us!—how we are to live. Salt is important in flavoring food, so our life as a disciple is to be an example of change in the world. Christ is our light and at our baptism we receive the light of Christ, which we are to carry into the world.

A family prayer service could center around a large candle with a small one for each family member. Begin in the dark, then first light the large candle (representing Christ); notice how the light shows us the way and gives warmth. Next have each member light their candle. Notice how much more light there is with us joining together to share the light of Christ.

Talk about some of the good works that you do (or have done) that spread the light of Christ. Do you think that what you do, or have done, has changed anything? You? Others?
