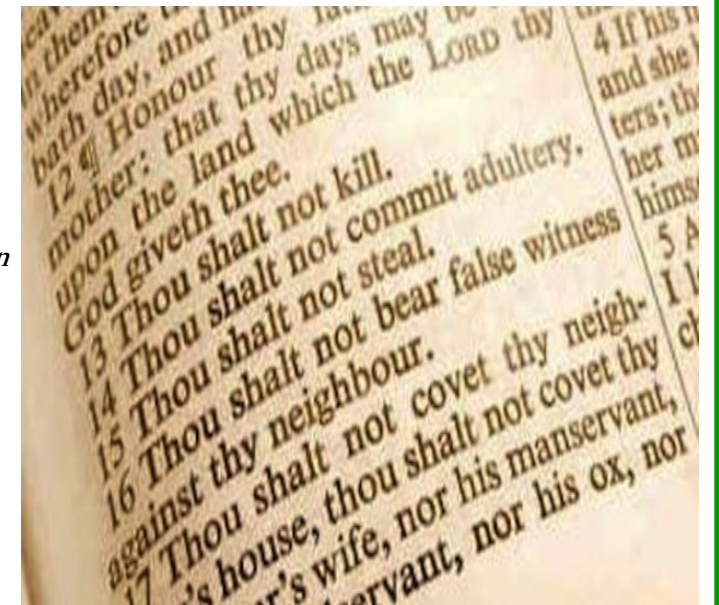
Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:17- 37

In this gospel passage, we find Jesus teaching his disciples about the Ten Commandments. The Commandments deal with the symptoms. Jesus teaches his disciples that they must not only follow the Commandments, but also avoid the attitudes & behaviors that lead to a sin against the Commandments. Avoid the causes. Avoid anger, avoid lust, etc.

Jesus talks about the importance of making - and keeping - an oath (a promise you make in the name of God).

Have you ever broken a promise that you made? Describe what that felt like. Did it affect your relationship with the person you made the promise to? How?

Last weekend was "commitment weekend" for the Archbishop's Catholic Appeal (ACA). Perhaps you received a personalized commitment card in the mail. If you did not receive a commitment card in the mail, pledge envelopes are available.

I hope you have had a chance to read the ACA materials you received in the bulletin last weekend and prayerfully reflect on the level of commitment you will make. The ACA provides substantial financial support to essential ministries that support parishes in our Catholic Church in western Oregon, providing education and faith formation at all levels and a Catholic presence for tens of thousands of people. When we stop to count our abundant blessings, we are aware of how truly blessed we are. The ACA is an invitation to share your blessings and support for the Gospel mission here in western Oregon.

Your pledge is also a sign of your gratitude for God's generous abundance. While we can never out-do God in generosity, we are called to join in the mission of the Gospel as we put forth the gifts of life, goodness, and grace through the sharing of our own blessings from God.

Papal intention for February: Listen to the migrants' cries. We pray that the cries of our migrant brothers and sisters, victims of criminal trafficking, may be heard and considered.

If you have a child who needs baptism, please contact Fr. Pat to make the necessary arrangements. Baptism is scheduled in 2 weeks, on February 23, which is the last Sunday before Lent.

Next Sunday, February 23, is the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is also the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday. It is the last Sunday we may sing/say "Alleluia" until Easter Sunday on April 12. Since it is the last Sunday to sing "Alleluia" it is also called "Alleluia Sunday".

We will have infant baptisms on "Alleluia Sunday" at the 10:30 am Mass. That is another reason to sing Alleluia.

Tuesday, February 25, is Fat Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday. We will have our Fat Tuesday Pancake and Sausage dinner on Fat Tuesday beginning at 5:30 pm. We will also burn the palms and also sing some Alleluia songs. See the flyer in today's bulletin for more information.

The Masses for Ash Wednesday are 9:00 am and 7:00 pm in the Church and 2:00 pm in the Village.

Lent is a special time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving - and more..

The Church informs us we must fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, April 10, And we need to "abstain" on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. The Church encourages us to maintain the fast and abstinence of Good Friday through Holy Saturday until after the Easter Vigil.

To fast means to eat less food—approximately two meals instead of three. And to abstain means to abstain from meat, but it is okay to eat fish, seafood, cheese, eggs, legumes, etc.

We are hoping to have faith sharing groups for Lent, based on Bishop Robert Barron's "Letter to a Suffering Church." Next week we'll have sign up sheets available.
