Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:38-48

In this passage from the Book of Matthew, Jesus teaches his disciples (and us!) another difficult lesson: if someone hurts us, we are not to seek revenge, we are not to get even! We can pray for the people who hurt us, pray for our enemies! Love your enemy. Treat everyone as if they are your best friend. God lets the rain fall on the good and bad. He lets the sun shine on the good and bad. He treats them the same. This is a lesson for us in how we treat the good and the bad.

*Have you ever felt like you wanted to get even with someone who hurt you?*

*If you answered yes, did you actually get even with them? Talk about what happened. What did that feel like? Was it very satisfying?*

*If you're angry or upset with someone right now, take a moment and say a prayer for them.*

- You may bring your palm branches back to church and place them in the metal container near the baptistery. Also bring back your used blessed chalk.

Two weekends ago was "commitment weekend" for the **Archbishop's Catholic Appeal (ACA)**. Perhaps you received a personalized commitment card in the mail. If you did not receive a commitment card in the mail, pledge envelopes are available.

I hope you have had a chance to read the ACA materials you received in the bulletin last weekend and prayerfully reflect on the level of commitment you will make. The ACA provides substantial financial support to essential ministries that support parishes in our Catholic Church in western Oregon, providing education and faith formation at all levels and a Catholic presence for tens of thousands of people. When we stop to count our abundant blessings, we are aware of how truly blessed we are. The ACA is an invitation to share your blessings and support for the Gospel mission here in western Oregon.

Your pledge is also a sign of your gratitude for God's generous abundance. While we can never out-do God in generosity, we are called to join in the mission of the Gospel as we put forth the gifts of life, goodness, and grace through the sharing of our own blessings from God.

Each spring (usually in May) Archbishop Sample celebrates the **Sacrament of Confirmation for Adults** who have not yet had this Sacrament. **This Sunday, February 23,** is the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday. It is also called "Alleluia Sunday" because it is the last Sunday we may sing/say "Alleluia" until Easter Sunday on April 12.

We will have infant baptisms on Alleluia Sunday at the 10:30 am Mass. That is another reason to sing Alleluia.

Tuesday, February 25, is Fat Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday. We will have our Fat Tuesday Pancake & Sausage dinner that day beginning at 5:30 pm. We will also burn the palms and also sing some Alleluia songs.

The Masses for Ash Wednesday are 9:00 am and 7:00 pm in the Church and 2:00 pm in the Village.

Lent is a special time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving and more.

The Church informs us we must fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, April 10. We need to abstain on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. The Church encourages us to maintain the fast and abstinence of Good Friday through Holy Saturday until after the Easter Vigil.

To fast means to eat less food: approximately two meals instead of three. And to abstain means to refrain from eating meat, but it is okay to eat fish, seafood, cheese, eggs, legumes, etc.
