**From Fr. Pat’s Pen:**

- I am excited and grateful to announce that, thanks to a benefactor, we are able to host a live drama from St. Luke’s Production on “St. Francis of Assisi: Troubadour of God’s Peace” here at St. Anthony on Thursday, March 23 at 7:00 pm in the church. This is a wonderful addition to our Centennial Celebration. Both St. Francis and St. Anthony are Franciscan, and they lived at the same time, though St. Francis was a little older. We will take up a free-will offering at the event.
- Thank you to all our centennial benefactors including the benefactor for the matching grant, for the live drama on St. Francis, and for the wine for our June banquet.
- We have applied for five Safety First Grant projects. Thank you for your input & your help with the process. A special thanks to Harold McNeese.
- The three small faith sharing groups are going well. Our principle text is Pope Francis’ Apostolic Exhortation, “The Joy of the Gospel”. And we use a study guide.
- You may bring back any portion of the chalk that did not get used for your Epiphany Blessing. The chalk is blessed and should not be put in the garbage. A basket for your chalk is available in the entrance of the church.

The following is posted on the Archdiocesan website: “St. Patrick’s Day falls on a Friday in Lent this year. Archbishop Sample has confirmed that local pastors can dispense in individual cases from the obligation to abstain from meat on Friday, March 17. Typically, when a dispensation is given, the faithful would be asked to abstain from meat on another day that week or to offer another sacrifice or work of mercy instead. No general dispensation has been granted for the Archdiocese of Portland.”

If you wish to be dispensed from abstinence on St. Patrick’s Day, you may be dispensed if you follow the Archbishop’s recommendations of performing another sacrifice, work of mercy or abstain from meat on another day.
