Third Sunday of Lent

John 4:5-42

While in Samaria, Jesus stopped at a well for water. There he met a Samaritan woman who was surprised when Jesus asked her for some water. In general Samaritans and Jews did not like each other. Jesus explained to her about “living water” and how, when he gave it to someone, they would never be thirsty again and they would also live forever! The woman came to believe this and that Jesus was indeed the Messiah they had all been waiting for. She told many others about her encounter with Jesus, and many of the Samaritans also came to believe in Jesus.

*Do you have any prejudices? What are they? Do they get in the way of how you treat others? How? How might you “get over” your prejudices?*

*Would you have recognized Jesus at the well and believed? Why or why not?*

I hope you have had a chance to read the ACA materials you received in the bulletin and prayerfully reflect on the level of commitment you will make. The ACA provides substantial financial support to essential ministries that support parishes in our Catholic Church in western Oregon, providing education and faith formation at all levels and a Catholic presence for tens of thousands of people. When we stop to count our abundant blessings, we are aware of how truly blessed we are. The ACA is an invitation to share your blessings and support for the Gospel mission here in western Oregon.

### CORONA CORNER

There is a memo in today's bulletin from Archbishop Sample regarding the coronavirus, stating that people 60 and over are encouraged not to come to Sunday Mass. The Memo says other things like the possibility of coming to daily Mass, of watching Sunday Mass on TV, of making a spiritual Communion and other ways of keeping Sunday holy.

Remember also to (The 10 Corona Commandments):

1) wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds. (Some people suggest singing a song like "Happy Birthday" while washing your hands. Maybe, instead, you say the "Our Father", or the "Hail Mary" and "Glory Be", etc.  
2) Cover your cough and your sneeze. Cough into your "elbow", sneeze into a tissue and put it in the trash.

3) If you are sick, stay home.

4) Practice social distancing—make an effort to stay at least six (6) feet away from other people. Avoid crowds.

5) At Mass we do not shake hands or hold hands.

6) At Mass we do not offer the Chalice (the Precious Blood) The exception to this is if someone is allergic to wheat. If you are allergic to wheat or gluten and wish to receive communion, please let me know so we can arrange for you to receive the Precious Blood.

7) It is easier to pass the virus when one receives communion on the tongue. It is more difficult to pass the virus when receiving communion on the hand.

8) Avoid touching one's face, especially one's eyes, nose and mouth.

9) Pray for a healthy resolution to this pandemic.

10) Check on your neighbor—for health, for food, etc
