### CORONA CORNER

Because of the danger of the coronavirus, Archbishop Sample has canceled all public Masses in the Archdiocese of Portland. Parishioners are to do the best they can at home watching Mass on TV, saying other prayers, doing spiritual readings, making a spiritual Communion and other ways of keeping Sunday holy. An exception to the "No Mass" rule would be a funeral. But even with a funeral, the number in attendance would need to be held at 25 or less.

Priests are supposed to say daily Mass even if no one is attending. I will continue saying Mass as usual. Our Church will be open on Fridays from about 10 am to 4 pm for people to come to the Church and pray. There will not be Adoration of Fridays, though this could change. Glenn and I are working on being able to livestream a Mass. If we figure this out, we might livestream a Mass I celebrate at St. Anthony., preferably a Sunday Mass.

Remember also to (The 10 Corona Commandments):

- 1) wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds. (Some people suggest singing a song like "Happy Birthday" while washing your hands. Maybe, instead, you say the "Our Father", or the "Hail Mary" and "Glory Be", etc.
- 2) Cover your cough and your sneeze. Cough into your elbow, sneeze into a tissue and put it in the trash.
- 3) If you are sick, stay home.
- 4) Practice social distancing—make an effort to stay at least six (6) feet away from other people. Avoid crowds.
- 5) Do not shake hands or hold hands.
- 6) Sanitize surfaces that are commonly touched: door knobs, light switches, table tops, backs of pews, TV controls, Microwave buttons, Stove top controls.
- 7) Avoid touching one's face, especially one's eyes, nose and mouth.
- 8) Pray for a healthy resolution to this pandemic.
- 9) Check on your neighbor—for health, for food, etc.
- 10) Keep in touch—by phone, texting, email, etc
