### From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- Holy Week begins this weekend. It should be like an extended retreat and not a time for your usual schedule.
- The Solemnity of the Annunciation, which we usually celebrate on March 25, is bumped until the next available date when it is ranked higher than what ever else might be on the date; namely, Monday, April 9.
- All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence, i.e., no meat
- Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. We are encouraged to continue this fast and abstinence into Holy Saturday (the Paschal Fast).
- The Easter Vigil is Saturday, March 31 at 8:30 pm. There is no 4:30 pm Mass on this day.
- We have some extra centennial mugs. If your family did not get one, contact Fr. Pat or Paula Lang. And if your family did not get a spiritual book contact us, too. If you would like to purchase one of our extra centennial mugs they are \$3 for one or \$5 for two.

### Faith Formation for Adults and Children

1-12th Grade Religious Education: Our RE classes meet in the parish hall from 9:15am-10:15am each Sunday.
