Pope's Intention for April (Universal): For those who have responsibility in economic matters, that economists may have the courage to reject any economy of exclusion and know how to open new paths.

Next Sunday, April 8, is the second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a day in which we are especially mindful of God's mercy to us through Jesus. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited at 3:00 pm. A plenary indulgence is available for those who:

- 1) Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet here or elsewhere,
- 2) receive sacramental confession,
- 3) receive Eucharistic Communion, and
- 4) pray for the intentions of the Pope.

Sacramental confession does not need to be received on this Sunday but in a reasonable time before or after April 8. An important component of Divine Mercy Sunday is that we have received mercy and are in turn merciful to others.

From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- A big welcome this day and this week to all. I am glad you can join us in our journey with Jesus to Jerusalem, to the cross and out of the grave.
- The joy of Easter cannot be limited to one day. The Octave of Easter (April 1-8) is a special time for the Church when we celebrate the Resurrection. And the celebration of Easter lasts for 50 days until Pentecost (May 20). Mass will be celebrated each day during the Octave of Easter. The Gospels during the Octave of Easter are all from scriptures dealing with the Resurrection of Jesus.
- "Rice Bowls" may be returned at any time. Instead of returning a lot of small change, the money counters would appreciate if you wrote a check to St. Anthony for the total amount and write "Rice Bowl" in the memo line.
- The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord is usually celebrated on March 25. March 25 was Palm Sunday. The Annunciation is "bumped" until the next available date when it is ranked higher than what ever else might be on the date; namely, Monday, April 9.
- We have some extra centennial mugs. If your family did not get one, contact Fr. Pat or Paula Lang. And if your family did not get a spiritual book contact us, too. If you would like to purchase one of our extra centennial mugs they are \$3 for one or \$5 for two.
