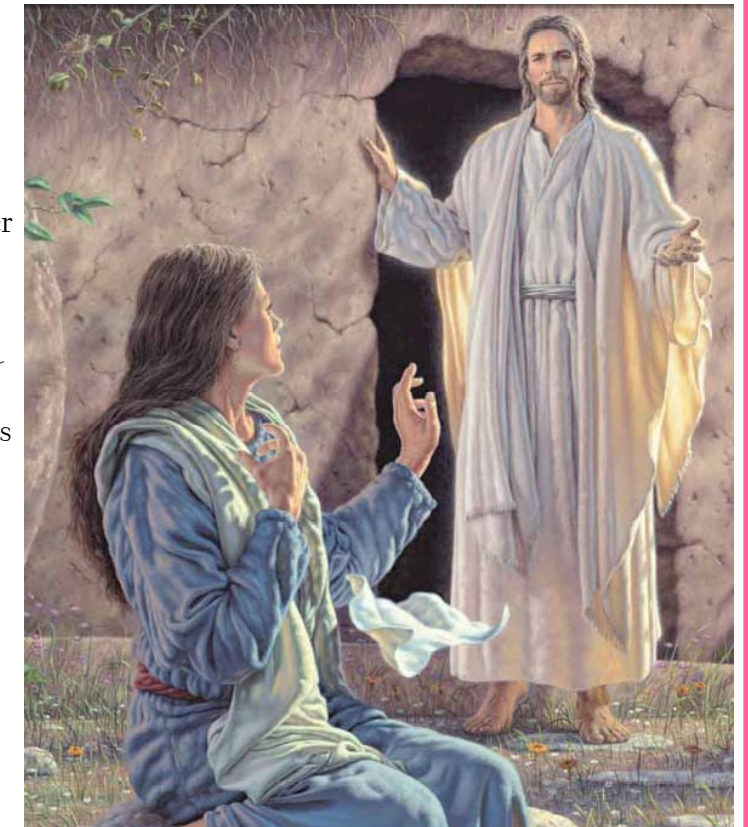

From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- A big welcome to all this day and this week. I am glad you can join us in our journey with Jesus to Jerusalem, to the cross and out of the grave.
- Rice Bowl contributions may be returned now. Instead of returning lots of small change, our money counters would appreciate if you wrote a check to St. Anthony for the total amount, with “Rice Bowl” in the memo line.
- Thank you to all our centennial benefactors, including the benefactor for the matching grant, for the live drama on St. Francis, and for the wine for our June banquet.
- The funeral for Fran McCann is Friday, April 28 at 11 am.
- We are making progress toward exterior painting of the parish buildings, including the church, the parish hall, the child development building and the rectory.
- We should receive the official word soon, but the preliminary indication is that we have four **Safety First grant projects** approved including: rekeying the parish locks, filling in dirt where it is recessed from the sidewalks, guardrail for the baptism font and a security light.
- All parishioners should have received a letter about a matching grant opportunity. We have been offered a grant up to \$5,000 if we can match it. Thank you to those who have already responded. If you did not get a letter please contact the Parish Office.
- The joy of Easter cannot be limited to one day. The Octave of Easter (April 16-23) is a special time for the Church when we celebrate the Resurrection. And the celebration of Easter lasts for 50 days. Mass will be celebrated each day during the Octave of Easter. The Gospels during the Octave of Easter are all from scriptures dealing with the Resurrection of Jesus.

- Some of you might know Ruth Fry. She was a long time parishioner at St. Ignatius. More recently she lived at St. Anthony Village. She died on Holy Saturday, April 15—at the age of 106. May she rest in peace.

Next Sunday, April 23, is the Second Sunday of Easter, also known as **Divine Mercy Sunday**. It is a day in which we are especially mindful of God's mercy to us through Jesus. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited at 3:00 pm. A plenary indulgence is available for those who:

- 1) Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet here or elsewhere,
- 2) received sacramental confession,
- 3) receive Eucharistic Communion, and
- 4) pray for the intentions of the Pope.

Sacramental confession does not need to take place on this Sunday but in a reasonable time before or after April 23. An important component of Divine Mercy Sunday is that we have received mercy and are in turn merciful to others.
