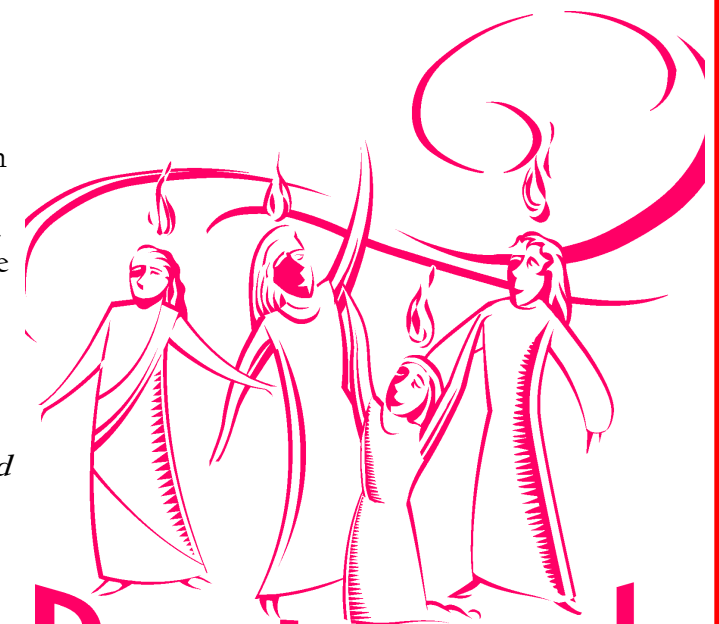
May 20 Pentecost John 20:19-23

New offering envelopes and online giving: Beginning June 10, your envelopes will look a bit different. As a way to save money by reducing paper and postage, we have contracted with Church Budget to provide our offering envelopes, and will also be implementing an online giving function for those who have been interested. In a few weeks you will be able to establish an online offertory account with myEoffering.com to streamline your contributions to St. Anthony by setting up electronic funds transfer from a bank account or credit card, and you will be able to choose when and how often your contributions are sent. Your account will show the second collections a week in advance, allowing you to plan accordingly. For tax purposes nothing will change; we will still provide your donations summary in January. If you are receiving envelopes now, you may keep receiving them or choose to go paperless, thereby conserving your checks and minimizing wasted envelopes and postage.
