Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 4:26-34

In today's gospel reading from Mark, we hear two stories, or parables, about farming. In the first one, the farmer scatters seeds in his fields, and then does nothing else to help them grow. And, yet, even without his help, the seeds grow into plants that flourish and produce fruit. The second story is about the mustard seed, which is one of the tiniest of all seeds. When planted, this teeny tiny seed grows into a plant that is about as tall as the ceiling in your home and becomes a home for birds. The mustard seed story seems to tell us that even from such small, humble beginnings, truly great things can happen! In these parables, the seeds represent faith, our belief in God. This faith is planted deep inside us, and as we grow, so does our faith!

**New offering envelopes and online giving:** Beginning June 10, your envelopes will look a bit different. As a way to save money by reducing paper and postage, we have contracted with Church Budget to provide our offering envelopes, and will also be implementing an online giving function for those who have been interested. In a few weeks you will be able to establish an online offertory account with myEoffering.com to streamline your contributions to St. Anthony by setting up electronic funds transfer from a bank account or credit card, and you will be able to choose when and how often your contributions are sent. Your account will show the second collections a week in advance, allowing you to plan accordingly. For tax purposes nothing will change; we will still provide your donations summary in January. If you are receiving envelopes now, you may keep receiving them or choose to go paperless, thereby conserving your checks and minimizing wasted envelopes and postage. ## Faith Formation for Adults and Children

**1-12th Grade Religious Education:** Our RE classes are finished for this year. We will start back up again at the end of September, 2018.

**ACA:** The ACA has received 59 gifts averaging \$107 for a total of \$6332 of our goal of \$11,611, which is 55% of goal.

Last weekend we began a couple of changes at the direction of Archbishop Sample. At Mass we will kneel after the Lamb of God. We have also discontinued Communion Services, which means no Communion Services on Monday mornings.

Instead of communion services, Archbishop recommends locating a church that has a Monday morning Mass. The nearest one to us is St. Ignatius, which has a Monday Mass at 8:00 am. St. Agatha has an 8:30 am Mass and Laurelhurst Village has an 11:00 am Mass.

Here is a recommendation from Fr. Pat: if you need to use one of the power doors to enter or leave the church or the parish hall, please use it. That's why we put them in. Otherwise, use the non-power door. In a word, I think this will extend the life of the power doors, due to fewer repairs.
