June 24: The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist Luke 1:57-66, 80

This reading tells us about Elizabeth and Zechariah, the parents of John the Baptist. Elizabeth was a relative of Jesus' mother, Mary, and was thought to be too old to have children. But, late in her life she did give birth to a son, and her family and friends thought that God had truly blessed her. At that time in Israel, a son was usually named after his grandfather or father. But, instead, Elizabeth and Zechariah name their son John, which means "The Lord has been gracious."

Faith Formation for Adults and Children

1-12th Grade Religious Education: Our RE classes are finished for this year. We will start back up again at the end of September, 2018.

Bible Class: "The Book of Genesis". **Thursday at 9:15 am** in the parish hall. Leader: Glenn Rymysza. This class examines the richness of the imagery of Genesis in context.

ACA: The ACA has received 59 gifts averaging \$107 for a total of \$6332 of our goal of \$11,611, which is 55% of goal.

Here is a recommendation from Fr. Pat: if you need to use one of the power doors to enter or leave the church or the parish hall, please use it. That's why we put them in. Otherwise, use the non-power door. In a word, I think this will extend the life of the power doors, due to fewer repairs.

New offering envelopes and online giving: As a way to save money by reducing paper and postage, we have contracted with Church Budget to provide our offering envelopes, and will also be implementing an online giving function for those who have been interested. In a few weeks you will be able to establish an online offertory account with myEoffering.com to streamline your contributions to St. Anthony by setting up electronic funds transfer from a bank account or credit card, and you will be able to choose when and how often your contributions are sent. Your account will show the second collections a week in advance, allowing you to plan accordingly. For tax purposes nothing will change; we will still provide your donations summary in January. If you are receiving envelopes now, you may keep receiving them or choose to go paperless, thereby conserving your checks and minimizing wasted envelopes and postage. See the poster in the church for more details, and watch the church website for enrollment links.

Next weekend, June 30—July 1, we will take the **Peter's Pence collection**, (Collection for the Holy Father), which provides Pope Francis with the funds he needs to carry out his charitable works around the world. The proceeds benefit our brothers and sisters on the margins of society, including victims of war, oppression, and disasters.
