July 1 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 5:21- 43

In today's gospel reading from Mark, we hear about two of Jesus' miracles. A synagogue official named Jairus goes up to Jesus, falls at his feet and pleads for Jesus to come and heal his young daughter, who is dying. As Jesus goes with Jairus, a woman who has been hemorrhaging for twelve years comes up behind Jesus and touches his cloak. No doctor has been able to cure her and she believes that if she can just touch the cloak of Jesus she will be healed. And this is just what happens: her bleeding stops. Jesus is aware that power has gone out of him and asks who touched his clothing. She tells him the truth, and he tells her that her faith has saved her, and that she is cured. Jesus then goes to the home of Jairus, where people are wailing and crying and saying that the girl has died. But Jesus says to have faith, and then goes inside, takes her hand and tells her to rise. She immediately stands up and walks around, to the astonishment of everyone present.

How do you treat people who are different from you?

How could you be more like Jesus towards those who are different?

From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- Our extra centennial mugs are \$3 for one or \$5 for two.
- Mass times in our Vicariate are posted on the tri-part bulletin board in the entry of the church. A list of confession times in SE Portland may also be found there.
- Last Sunday we celebrated the Nativity of St. John the Baptist instead of the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel for 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time is Mark's account of Jesus calming the storm on the Sea of Galilee. (Mark 4:35-41) The first reading was Job 38:8-11, also worth reading. Check out these readings we missed.
- In this season of vacations you might want to access MassTime.org or call 1-858-207-6277 to learn of Mass times in the areas you will be vacationing. When you call or go on line have the desired zip code handy.
- This Sunday the second reading is from 8th chapter of Paul's 2nd letter to the Corinthians (II Cor 8:9). In the middle of the reading Paul says: "For you know the gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich." (Similar to St. Anthony's quote posted in the entry of the Church.)

Our first annual **Kathy Warner Memorial Blood Drive** is fast approaching, on **July 5, 2018 from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm** in the Parish Hall. There are still a few donor slots available if you want to sign up. The Red Cross will be donating **free T-shirts** and the Pastoral Council will be passing out **homemade cookies** and a **rose** (Kathy's favorite flower) to those who donate or try to donate. New offering envelopes and online giving: As a way to save money by reducing paper and postage, we have contracted with Church Budget to provide our offering envelopes, and will also be implementing an online giving function for those who have been interested. In a few weeks you will be able to establish an online offertory account with myEoffering.com to streamline your contributions to St. Anthony by setting up electronic funds transfer from a bank account or credit card, and you will be able to choose when and how often your contributions are sent. Your account will show the second collections a week in advance, allowing you to plan accordingly. For tax purposes nothing will change; we will still provide your donations summary in January. If you are receiving envelopes now, you may keep receiving them or choose to go paperless, thereby conserving your checks and minimizing wasted envelopes and postage.
