Luke 10:25-37

A Jewish legal expert tests Jesus by asking what he must do to inherit eternal life. After a process of question and counter-question, the lawyer asks who is one's neighbor. In reply, Jesus tells the story of the good Samaritan, a story in which a Samaritan is the neighbor--the hero of the story! And because at that time, Samaritans and Jews were enemies, it was difficult for the lawyer to accept this teaching. The lesson here is that the love of neighbor embraces all: Samaritan, Jew, everyone.

*How can you make them feel that they are your neighbor?*

- We will be replacing the boiler in the church in the near future. We replaced the boiler in the parish hall a couple of years ago, improving the system with a design that did not include a boiler. The cost for this is about \$24,000. Thank you to those who donated towards this project.
- Other projects this summer include signage for the road that runs between the parish hall and child development center, better lighting between the church and parish hall, and better lighting around the child development center.

We are once again looking for a janitor/maintenance person. Do you have any ideas and/or suggestions?

Fifty years ago on July 20, 1969, Apollo 11 landed on the moon. Upon their return, the three astronauts made a goodwill tour to many countries. One of the places that Neil Armstrong, Michael Collins and Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin stopped was at the Vatican on October 16, 1969. They had an audience with Pope Paul VI (now St. Paul VI). Pope Paul VI gifted them with a ceramic tile representing the Wise Men, telling the astronauts that, like them, the Magi were men of science who found their way by tracing the stars.

"Man has a natural urge to explore the unknown, to know the unknown; yet man has also a fear of the unknown," Paul VI said at the audience. "Your bravery has transcended this fear and through your intrepid adventure man has taken another step toward knowing more of the universe."

Also, like the original Magi, the astronauts came bearing gifts; The Apollo 11 lunar sample display, a wooden plaque containing the Vatican flag, and four moon-rocks" that remain on display at the Vatican Museums.
