July 29     17th Sunday in Ordinary Time     John 6:1-15

In this Gospel reading, John tells us that Jesus crosses the Sea of Galilee. The huge crowd of people follows him, because they had seen him healing the sick. Although he already knows what he is going to do, Jesus looks at all the people and asks Philip where they can buy enough food to feed them all. Philip replies that even two hundred days worth of wages would not be enough to buy food for everyone! Simon Peter tells Jesus that a boy has five loaves of bread and two fish, but it is hardly enough. Jesus takes the food and gives thanks to God for it. His disciples then pass the baskets of food among the crowd, telling them to take as much as they need. Everyone eats their fill, and there is more than enough for them all! The people see this miracle, and began to say that Jesus must be "the Prophet, the one who was to come into the world."

From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- Mass times in our Vicariate are posted on the tri-part bulletin board in the entry of the church. A list of confession times in SE Portland may also be found there.
- In this time of vacations, you might want to access Mass-Time.org or call 1-858-207-6277 to learn of Mass times in the areas you will be vacationing. When you call or go online, have the desired zip code handy.
- **In this hot weather**, drink plenty of water, call if you need help, check on your neighbor, avoid overheating, etc.

In the next few months we are scheduled to do extensive work on the outside of our four buildings: church, parish hall, child development building and the rectory. The expected cost of this work is over \$220,000.

This summer we will be replacing the boiler in the church. We replaced the boiler in the parish hall a couple years ago. We improved the system with a design that did not include a boiler. As I recall, the cost two years ago was over \$15,000.

We have begun fixing the ceiling lights in the church. At times there will be scaffolding in the church, and we will have less lighting while the repairs take place. This Safety First Project is expected to last through August.

We are also making progress on our other Safety First Projects, including the painting of the fire lane curb between the parish hall and the child development center.

**Faith Formation for Adults and Children**

**1-12th Grade Religious Education:** Our RE classes are finished for this year. We will start back up again in September, 2018.

**Bible Class:** "The Book of Genesis". **Thursday at 9:15 am** in the parish hall. Leader: Glenn Rymysza. This class examines the richness of the imagery of Genesis in context. We are taking a break for the month of July. Our next class will be Thursday, August 9.

Here is a recommendation from Fr. Pat: if you need to use one of the power doors to enter or leave the church or the parish hall, please use it. That's why we put them in. Otherwise, use the non-power door. In a word, I think this will extend the life of the power doors, due to fewer repairs.

If you have a child who needs to be baptized, please contact Fr. Pat to make the necessary arrangements.

**Archbishop's Catholic Appeal:** The ACA has received 64 gifts averaging \$101 for a total of \$6451 of our goal of \$11,611, which is 56% of goal.

We are in Liturgical Year "B". Mostly what this means is that most of the Sunday Gospels are from Mark. Mark is the shortest of the four Gospels. Those in the Vatican who designed our liturgies chose to insert the account of the Discourse on the Bread of Life (John 6:1-69) at this time of year.. The Discourse on the Bread of Life begins next Sunday and continues through the month of August—a total of five Sundays. If we had continued the sequential reading of Mark's Gospel next Sunday we would have heard Mark's (first) account of the multiplication of loaves and fishes. The Synoptic Gospels' Multiplication of Loaves & Fishes are similar. Instead we hear an account from John on the multiplication of the loaves & fishes & a teaching from Jesus on the Eucharist. We skip Mark 6:35—56. When we resume Mark's gospel on the first Sunday in September (22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time) we begin reading from Mark 7:1.
