John 6:24-35

In this part of John's Gospel, we hear how a crowd of people followed Jesus because he had given them bread to eat. Jesus told them not to spend their lives working for regular food -- food that doesn't last. Instead they should work for food that will make them live forever, that is, the "bread of life." Jesus is not saying that regular food isn't important, obviously we need it to be healthy. But Jesus wants us to see the importance of having his life within us. And so, he wants us to have the "bread of life."

From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- Mass times in our Vicariate are posted on the tri-part bulletin board in the entry of the church. A list of confession times in SE Portland may also be found there.
- In this time of vacations, you might want to access Mass-Time.org or call 1-858-207-6277 to learn of Mass times in the areas you will be vacationing. When you call or go online, have the desired zip code handy.
- **In this hot weather**, drink plenty of water, call if you need help, check on your neighbor, avoid overheating, etc. And if you think it is hot here just remember it is hotter in that place of eternal punishment.

In the next few months we are scheduled to do extensive work on the outside of our four buildings: church, parish hall, child development building and the rectory. The expected cost of this work is about \$250,000.

This summer we will be replacing the boiler in the church. We replaced the boiler in the parish hall a couple years ago. We improved the system with a design that did not include a boiler. As I recall, the cost two years ago was about \$18,000.

We have begun fixing the ceiling lights in the church. At times there will be scaffolding in the church, and we will have less lighting while the repairs take place. This Safety First project is expected to last through August.

We are also making progress on our other Safety First projects, including the painting of the fire lane curb between the parish hall and the child development center.

Faith Formation for Adults and Children

1-12th Grade Religious Education: Our RE classes are finished for this year. We will start back up again in September, 2018.

Here is a recommendation from Fr. Pat: if you need to use one of the power doors to enter or leave the church or the parish hall, please use it. That's why we put them in. Otherwise, if you don't need the assistance of the power door, please use the non-power door. In a word, I think this will extend the life of the power doors, due to fewer repairs.

Archdiocese of Portland supports the **"Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion" Act** Through the Oregon Health Plan, Oregon taxpayers fund 10 abortions every day. The Archdiocese of Portland supports the Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion ballot measure.

If passed, this constitutional amendment would save thousands of lives and spare mothers and families from the ensuing grief that always comes with the death of a child through abortion. According to the Oregon Health Authority, approximately 3,700 abortions were publicly funded through the Oregon Health Plan in fiscal year 2015-16. Last year, Gov. Kate Brown signed HB 3391 into law to further increase taxpayer-funded abortion and require private health insurers to cover abortion without a copay.
