John 6:51-58

This Gospel reading from the Book of John gives us Eucharist elements once again. The language and images in this Gospel give us a deeper understanding of the Eucharist. They show a sacramental richness and beauty. Jesus speaks of those who eat his flesh and drink his blood. In this passage, Jesus states, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven," "I will raise him on the last day," and "I have life because of the Father."

What do the words "eat my flesh and drink my blood" refer to?

What does the statement "my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" mean?

When we celebrate Eucharist, what do we become?

What are some of the ways we show that Jesus is part of our lives?

From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- Our extra centennial mugs are \$3 for one or \$5 for two.
- Mass times in our Vicariate are posted on the tri-part bulletin board in the entry of the church. A couple of options are listed for Monday morning Mass. A list of confession times in SE Portland may also be found there.
- In this time of vacations, you might want to access Mass-Time.org or call 1-858-207-6277 to learn of Mass times in the areas you will be vacationing. When you call or go online, have the desired zip code handy.
- **In this hot weather**, drink plenty of water, call if you need help, check on your neighbor, avoid overheating, etc. And if you think it is hot here just remember it is hotter in that place of eternal punishment.

In the next few months we are scheduled to do extensive work on the outside of our four buildings: church, parish hall, child development building and the rectory. The expected cost of this work is about \$250,000.

- This summer we will be replacing the boiler in the church. We replaced the boiler in the parish hall a couple years ago. We improved the system with a design that did not include a boiler. As I recall, the cost two years ago was about \$18,000.
- We have begun fixing the ceiling lights in the church. At times there will be scaffolding in the church, and we will have less lighting while the repairs take place. This Safety First project is expected to last through August.
- We are also making progress on our other Safety First projects, including the painting of the fire lane curb between the parish hall and the child development center.

Faith Formation for Adults and Children

1-12th Grade Religious Education: Our RE classes are finished for this year. We will start back up again in September, 2018.

Bible Class: "The Book of Genesis". **Thursday at 9:15 am** in the parish hall. Leader: Glenn Rymysza. This class examines the richness of the imagery of Genesis in context. We are taking a break for the month of July.

Here is a recommendation from Fr. Pat: if you need to use one of the power doors to enter or leave the church or the parish hall, please use it. That's why we put them in. Otherwise, if you don't need the assistance of the power door, please use the non-power door. In a word, I think this will extend the life of the power doors, due to fewer repairs.

If you have a child who needs to be baptized, please contact Fr. Pat to make the necessary arrangements.

A special invitation to those who are not Catholic: if you are not Catholic and would like to learn more about the Catholic faith, please contact Fr. Pat or Glenn to learn about the opportunities. We hope to gather enough people to establish a little group.

Archbishop's Catholic Appeal: The ACA has received 64 gifts averaging \$101 for a total of \$6451 of our goal of \$11,611, which is 56% of goal.

Archdiocese of Portland supports the **"Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion" Act**: Through the Oregon Health Plan, Oregon taxpayers fund ten abortions every day. The Archdiocese of Portland supports the Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion ballot measure. If passed, this constitutional amendment would save thousands of lives and spare mothers and families from the ensuing grief that always comes with the death of a child through abortion. According to the Oregon Health Authority, approximately 3,700 abortions were publicly funded through the Oregon Health Plan in fiscal year 2015-16. Last year, Gov. Kate Brown signed HB 3391 into law to further increase taxpayer-funded abortion and require private health insurers to cover abortion without a copay.

WHAT IS CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP? Stewardship is not simply making donations or taking care of the buildings and grounds. It is a spirituality, a way of life, made of four parts: receiving the gifts of God with gratitude; cultivating them responsibly; sharing them lovingly in justice with others; standing before the Lord in a spirit of accountability.
