Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 13:22-30

Luke uses one of Jesus' favorite teaching methods in the Gospel for this Sunday – the parable. A parable uses one situation or story to explain the meaning of other situations. In this week's Gospel passage, Jesus tells us a parable about who will be able to enter the Kingdom of God, which is described as a "narrow gate." Jesus says that we must try very hard to follow his teaching and that it will not always be easy for us—that is, it isn't always easy to do what is "right."

What are some things that make it hard for you to do what is "right?"

Faith Formation for Adults and Children

1-12th Grade Religious Education: Our RE classes and Sacramental Prep classes have concluded for this year. We will resume classes in September.

The Seven Principles of Catholic Social Teaching

- 1) Life and Dignity of the Human Person - all people are sacred and made in the image and likeness of God.
- 2) Call to Family, Community and Participation - The human person is both sacred and social. We realize our dignity and rights in relationship with others, in community.
- 3) Rights and Responsibilities - People have a fundamental right to life, food, shelter, health care, education and employment.
- 4) Option for the poor and vulnerable - The moral test of a society is how they treat its most vulnerable members.
- 5) The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers - People have a right to decent and productive work, fair wages, private property and economic initiative. The economy exists to serve the people, not the other way around.
- 6) Solidarity - We are one human family. Our responsibilities to each other cross national, racial, economic & ideological differences. We are called to work globally for justice.
- 7) Care of God's Creation - The goods of the earth are gifts from God. We have a responsibility to care for these goods as stewards and trustees, not as mere consumers and users.

WHAT IS CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP? Stewardship is not simply making donations or taking care of the buildings and grounds. It is a spirituality, a way of life, made of four parts: receiving the gifts of God with gratitude; cultivating them responsibly; sharing them lovingly in justice with others; standing before the Lord in a spirit of accountability
