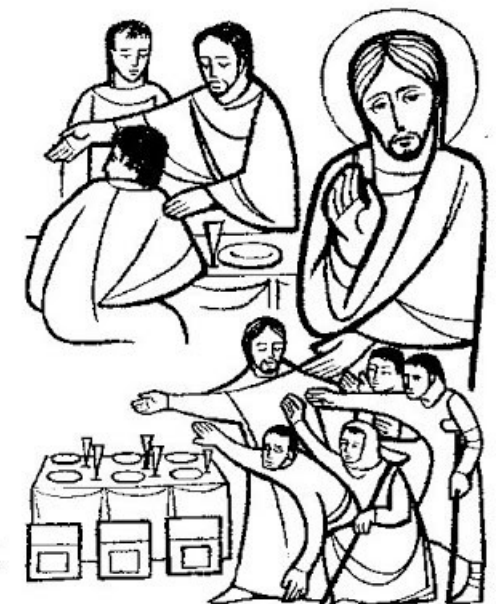
September 1 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 14:1, 7-14

Luke uses one of Jesus' favorite teaching modes in the Gospel for this Sunday: the parable. The parable is an interesting form of literature in that it is never meant to be taken literally. A parable uses one situation to examine a second. The gospel for this week deals with humility. The setting and story about a meal are meant to help us consider the heavenly banquet to which we are all called. The invitation comes regardless of our station in life and is not based on merit. God's generosity makes scrambling for position at the banquet senseless and fruitless. Once we have realized how undeserving we are of the invitation, the more exalted we are in accepting the invitation. This is the humility to which we are called.

What does it mean for you to be "humble before God?"

What opportunities are available in your community to care for the least (seemingly) in the Kingdom of God?

How can we best respond to the cry of the poor and make it an example of accepting the invitation to the banquet?

The Seven Principles of Catholic Social Teaching

- 1) Life and Dignity of the Human Person - all people are sacred and made in the image and likeness of God.
- 2) Call to Family, Community and Participation - The human person is both sacred and social. We realize our dignity and rights in relationship with others, in community.
- 3) Rights and Responsibilities - People have a fundamental right to life, food, shelter, health care, education and employment.
- 4) Option for the poor and vulnerable - The moral test of a society is how they treat its most vulnerable members.
- 5) The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers - People have a right to decent and productive work, fair wages, private property and economic initiative. The economy exists to serve the people, not the other way around.
- 6) Solidarity - We are one human family. Our responsibilities to each other cross national, racial, economic & ideological differences. We are called to work globally for justice.
- 7) Care of God's Creation - The goods of the earth are gifts from God. We have a responsibility to care for these goods as stewards and trustees, not as mere consumers and users.
