Mark 10:35-45

Two of Jesus' apostles ask to be given the seats beside him in the glory of heaven. Jesus tells them they do not realize what it is they are asking, and then he asks them whether they can go through everything he will go through. They say they can.

Jesus responds by telling them they will go through those things, but that he cannot give them the places of honor in heaven because those places are already reserved. Jesus calls the apostles together and explains to them that although the rulers in the world are harsh and demanding leaders, the followers of Jesus who wish to be great should be a servant and a slave to others. He says, "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."



What did Jesus do to show that he was a servant to others?

How can you be a servant, too?

A ransom is payment made to rescue or save someone. What ransom did Jesus make? Who was he rescuing?

From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- "My E-offering" is now available to receive your electronic giving. I believe you may access it through the parish website at stanthonypdx.com.
- Our extra centennial mugs are \$3 for one, or \$5 for two.
- Beginning next weekend you are invited to bring statues of saints to Church to be placed on a table in the sanctuary, like we have done in previous years.
- Some of you have met my friend, Don. I've enjoyed his visit. He will be leaving this Tuesday.
- I grew the pumpkins in the Church.

In the next few months we are scheduled to do extensive work on the outside of our four buildings: church, parish hall, child development building and the rectory. If all the needed repairs were done, the cost could be \$650,000.

- We will be replacing the boiler in the church. We replaced the boiler in the parish hall a couple years ago. We improved the system with a design that did not include a boiler. As I recall, the cost two years ago was about \$18,000.

We are in the final steps of signing a contract agreement with a janitorial service, and expect them to begin soon. They will focus on cleaning the inside of the church and parish hall, but will not address maintenance issues or external work. I am asking you to take this opportunity to serve your parish by donating your time and talent occasionally when the need arises. We'd like to gather a list of **both men and women** willing to be called to do things.

We will need help in changing light bulbs, changing furnace filters, cleaning windows, minor painting, repairing leaky faucets and toilets, picking up litter around the church, parish hall and the child development center, snow shoveling, tree pruning, cleaning the three exterior church signs. This is not a complete list. Perhaps you are aware of other needs, or you have other talents that the parish can use. We will try to minimize your work by using a rotation of those who are available.

Please pray how you might help out and then give us a call. Please call Fr. Pat (503-771-6039), Diane Marcoe (503-775-6863), or David Fletcher (503-775-3074) to let us know how you might be able to help out. God bless you. Thanks for your help. Diane says we have talented people in the parish. She expects many of you to sign up. If you don't call, she says she might twist your arm. I don't think any of us want to see that.

Archdiocese of Portland supports the **"Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion" Act: Vote "Yes" on Measure 106.**

Through the Oregon Health Plan, Oregon taxpayers fund ten abortions every day. The Archdiocese of Portland supports the Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion ballot measure. If passed, this constitutional amendment would save thousands of lives and spare mothers and families from the ensuing grief that always comes with the death of a child through abortion. According to the Oregon Health Authority, approximately 3,700 abortions were publicly funded through the Oregon Health Plan in fiscal year 2015-16. Last year, Gov. Kate Brown signed HB 3391 into law to further increase taxpayer-funded abortion and require private health insurers to cover abortion without a copay.

Archbishop's Catholic Appeal: The ACA has received 64 gifts from St. Anthony parishioners averaging \$101 for a total of \$6451 of our goal of \$11,611, which is 56% of goal.

This weekend (October 20-21) we will have the monthly collection for the Poor and Needy. The materials have not yet arrived for the collection for the World Missions. Hopefully the materials will arrive this week, we can have them in the bulletin next weekend and have the collection on the first weekend of November. Next Sunday (October 28) is both "World Youth Day in the Parish" and also "Priesthood Sunday".
