Mark 10:46-52

Jesus was traveling with his disciples and many people. A blind man named Bartimaeus was sitting and begging on the side of the road and when he heard that Jesus was in the crowd he began to call to him, saying, "Have pity on me." Although some people told him to be quiet, Bartimaeus kept crying out, and so Jesus stopped and called for him. When Jesus asked what he wanted, Bartimaeus simply said, "Master, I want to see." Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." And Bartimaeus could see immediately.

*Have you ever thought about how many blind or sick or injured people were around in Jesus' day, and that he didn't run around trying to heal them all? Instead, he healed those who called out to him for help. What does this mean for us today?*

*What do you think Bartimaeus already knew about Jesus before he talked to him?*

*What does Jesus mean when he says 'your faith has saved you'?*

**Archdiocese of Portland supports the "Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion" Act: Vote "Yes" on Measure 106.**

Through the Oregon Health Plan, Oregon taxpayers fund ten abortions every day. The Archdiocese of Portland supports the Stop Taxpayer Funding for Abortion ballot measure. If passed, this constitutional amendment would save thousands of lives and spare mothers and families from the ensuing grief that always comes with the death of a child through abortion. According to the Oregon Health Authority, approximately 3,700 abortions were publicly funded through the Oregon Health Plan in fiscal year 2015-16. Last year, Gov. Kate Brown signed HB 3391 into law to further increase taxpayer-funded abortion and require private health insurers to cover abortion without a copay.
