From Fr. Pat's Pen:

- Our extra centennial mugs are \$3 for one, or \$5 for two.

- We plan to have the Advent Giving Tree this year. If you wish to donate gifts to a charity, use this opportunity.
- We will be replacing the boiler in the church. We replaced the boiler in the parish hall a couple years ago. We improved the system with a design that did not include a boiler. The cost for this is about \$22,000.

In the next few months we are scheduled to do extensive work on the outside of our four buildings: church, parish hall, child development building and rectory. If all the needed repairs were done, the cost could be \$650,000.

Year End Giving

Many of the year-end giving opportunities benefit the donors by providing tax benefits while providing a gift that affirms our priorities and values by giving to St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church. One of these is the Required Minimum Distribution (RMDs) which stipulates that anyone age 70 1/2 is required by law to begin taking distributions from their IRAs. In order to receive the tax benefit, this is done by having your investment company change the payee to St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church. The check cannot be payable to the parishioner. In order to receive the tax benefit, it must be payable to and given directly to St. Anthony. The parishioner is not taxed on this type of distribution.
