Holy Father's Intentions for May

For the formation of religious and seminarians

We pray that religious women and men, and seminarians, grow in their own vocations through their human, pastoral, spiritual and community formation, leading them to be credible witnesses to the Gospel.

Scriptures for Pentecost are

- Vigil: Gen 11:1-9; Ex 19:3-8, 16-20; Ez 37:1-14; Joel 3:1-5; Psalm 104:1-2, 24, 35, 27-30; Rom 8:22-27; John 7:37-39
- Sunday: Acts 2:1-11; Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-31, 34; 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13 or Galatians 5:16-25; Sequence: *Veni, Sancte Spiritus*; John 20:19-23 or Jn 15:26-27 and 16:12-15

St. John I, Pope, was a native to Tuscany, Italy. He was the 53rd pope, and the first "Pope John" in the Catholic Church. Prior to becoming pope on August 13, 523 AD, he served as an archdeacon. During his papal reign, King Theodoric adhered to the Arian heresy that Christ was not truly divine but a created being. At this time, the Byzantine Emperor Justin I ordered Arian clergy to surrender their churches into orthodox Catholic hands. King Theodoric expected Pope John I to intercede on his behalf and support the Arians in Constantinople. Pope John I's refusal led to his imprisonment and death from starvation. We celebrate his feast day on May 18, the day associated with his martyrdom in 526 AD.

The Ascension in the Catechism of the Catholic Church 659 "So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God. [Mk 16:19] Christ's body was glorified at the moment of his Resurrection, as proved by the new and supernatural properties it subsequently and permanently enjoys. [Lk 24:31; In 20:19, 26.] But during the forty days when he eats and drinks familiarly with his disciples and teaches them about the kingdom, his glory remains veiled under the appearance of ordinary humanity. [Acts 1:3; 10:41] Jesus' final apparition ends with the irreversible entry of his humanity into divine glory, symbolized by the cloud and by heaven, where he is seated from that time forward at God's right hand. [Acts 1:9; 2:33] Only in a wholly exceptional and unique way would Jesus show himself to Paul "as to one untimely born", in a last apparition that established him as an apostle. [1 Cor 15:8]
