In the Catholic Church, the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is celebrated on Sunday, July 27, 2025. This day is meant to be a celebration of the wisdom and contributions of grandparents and the elderly, and to promote intergenerational connections. The theme for 2025 is "Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (cf Sir. 14:2)

The readings for today speak of prayer, ask and you will receive, perseverance in prayer. Helen wanted to put the two together: Prayer and World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly and share a reflection from her life about her grandmother.

My grandmother, Juanita Quintana is an inspiration to me. Like Jesus, who taught his disciples how to pray, my Nana, taught me how to pray. I remember watching my Nana and my mom would "shoo" me away to not bother her while she was praying. My grandmother said to my mom let her come to me. I learned how to be contemplative as I watched my Nana, rosary in hand, the sunlight shining on her. My Nana was holy.

As we reflect on today's Gospel reading, reflect also on those individuals who inspired you to be the Catholic person you are today. Our grandparents and the elderly come packed with wisdom, humor, reflections, and beautiful stories that shaped their faith.

Call your grandparents, ask an elderly neighbor out for coffee, say hi to someone sitting in the next pew over. Listen to them, laugh with them, hold hands with them, and most importantly, pray with them. Joachim and Anne, who were Jesus's grandparents surely helped in forming his faith. Let's allow grandparents and the elderly help shape ours.
