Sunday, August 3 Luke 12:13-21

Luke 12:13-21 reflects on the dangers of greed and the importance of generosity, using the parable of the rich fool to illustrate the futility of accumulating wealth without regard for God or others. The passage urges listeners to examine their priorities and recognize that true fulfillment comes not from material possessions, but from a rich relationship with God and a generous spirit.

In essence, the passage encourages a shift in perspective from an inward focus on accumulation to an outward focus on generosity and love, recognizing that true life is found not in possessions but in a relationship with God.

What the family can use most is our financial assistance. If you are not able to give financially, perhaps you can give toys, books and clothes to the children.

The children are girls age 6, 2 and 5 months old and a 4 year old boy. If you wish to give toys, books, and clothes, bring the items to Saturday or Sunday Mass.
