**We are Saint Anthony of Padua Catholic Church, a Eucharistic family sharing the love of our Lord Jesus Christ with kindness and compassion.**

Sunday, August 10

Gospel: Luke 12:32-48

In the parable, Jesus tells his hearers to be ready, and 'see that you are dressed for action'. The one who has cultivated and accumulated much wealth and property cannot be ready because of the responsibility for and attachment to them. Therefore, they restrict one's freedom to respond to Jesus. Here, the parable highlights the uncertainty of the master's coming, which requires the slaves to be on heightened alertness. If this is to be seen as waiting in a state of heightened watchfulness, so that we will not get caught out when Jesus finally returns, that is an anxious existence to have.

However, Jesus assured us this would not be the case. As long as we are not constantly focused on and worried about our possessions, fearing that they can be taken away from us, we are ready to respond to Him. God has already promised us the 'treasure' or the 'kingdom' where nothing can take it away. All have to do is trust in him. That means having a sense of watchfulness and being ready to respond to Jesus, to his voice. There is nothing to fear if this treasure is where our hearts are.

Following the parable, we hear Jesus' discourse with Peter. Jesus did not directly answer Peter's question about to whom the servant-leadership is applied - the Twelve or the rest of those who follow Jesus. Instead, he responded by laying out the consequences of being sedentary, lazy and irresponsible. He contrasts the responsible household manager, the wise steward who takes charge of and responsibility for the slaves, with those who do the opposite. This passage ends with a warning that the degree of gifts given corresponds to the degree of responsibility in using the gifts, and how that is to be judged. We can see that this parabolic discourse give us helpful insights that a faith community can be nurtured and grow when servant-leadership is exercised responsibly.

This donation will not appear on your donations that the Church keeps track of. I was told that this type of donation is not tax deductible. You can always talk to your tax preparer.

What the family can use most is our financial assistance. If you are not able to give financially, perhaps you can give toys, books and clothes to the children.

The children are girls age 6, 2 and 6 months old and a 4 year old boy. If you wish to give toys, books, and clothes, bring the items to Saturday or Sunday Mass.
