If you wish to donate to help the children, a GoFundMe account has been set up.. A GoFundMe account keeps about 3% for administrative fees.

Or you can donate through the Parish by making a check out to St. Anthony and putting "Ysam Fund" in the Memo line. We will not charge any Administrative fee. This donation will not appear on your donations that the Church keeps track of. I was told that this type of donation is not tax deductible. You can always talk to your tax preparer.

What the family can use most is our financial assistance. If you are not able to give financially, perhaps you can give toys, books and clothes to the children.

The children are girls age 6, 2 and 6 months old and a 4 year old boy. If you wish to give toys, books, and clothes, bring the items to Saturday or Sunday Mass.
